Community Grants

Our broadest granting program which provides grants to support projects undertaken by charitable organizations within the greater Kingston area. It is funded each year from earnings on our pooled **Community Fund**, new **Smart & Caring Community Fund** and over **40 individual endowment funds** established by our generous donors. Twice a year, applications are invited for project proposals, which are reviewed by our local volunteer Grants Committee.

To date, the Foundation has funded **339 unique local organizations** and invested over **\$2 million** in local charities through our Community Grants Program.
